Instead, my comments on what I will always remember of Donald.....Lois and I grew up in Donald (and Joan's) house and we always felt as if it was another "home" for both of us....Sherrie, Susan, and Robbie were our close friends and our extra sisters/brother....very warm feeling always entering Donald's home....I can still hear Donald saying from another room...."Joanie".....he also taught me at least two good lessons...first, as a fellow golfer, realize that I will never be able to hit the golf ball as far or as well as the men so,instead, I should watch the LPGA and realize that the women hit the ball about the distance that the male "weekend golfer" can and that if we would just try to hit the ball the way the women do, we would do fine...the second lesson was really about relying (or not) on contractors....when the upstairs extension/bedroom was being built in the house in South Bellmore, even though there were workers whose job it was to put up the frame and build the room, every night Donald would go upstairs to the "job site" and would wedge very small pieces of wood into all of the cracks between the boards...he did that so that, even though he was having workers build the room, he knew that by adding wedges of wood, he would prevent the room from ever having a "draft" in the winter.....I enjoyed his view/take on life....although it has been many years since I have seen him, I will miss him.....and Donald, if you are reading this, please say hi to my mom and dad.....
