Stuart Jeremy Cohen, 60, of Aventura, Florida passed away on Sunday November 12, 2017 at his home.

A memorial service will be held at 12pm Sunday, November 19, 2017 at Levitt-Weinstein Memorial Chapel, 18840 W. Dixie Highway, North Miami Beach, Florida 33180. Rabbi Marc Labowitz will be officiating. A celebration of life will immediately follow at Sardelis, Hollywood, Florida.

Stuart was born March 2, 1957 in London, England to Emanuel & Joy (Sivyer) Cohen. He was raised in Westham, where he worked in his father's furniture factory until he started his business in theatre tickets in the West End. Stuart married his soul mate, Jennifer Joy Zook, in the Cayman Islands on May 21, 2005. In 2007 they welcomed their daughter Cia Calypso. In 2011 they had their first son, Cruz. And in 2012 twin boys, Cooper and Camden, completed their family of six. These four amazing kids were his pride and joy and he was fiercely loved by them all. Stuart and Jennifer made their home in London, England until they moved their family to Miami, Florida in 2008.

Stuart was energetic, full of life and a passionate jump-roper. He loved the gym and believed in the power of one addict helping another.

Stuart is survived by his four children, Cia Calypso(10), Cruz (6), twin boys Cooper (4) and Camden (4); his wife of 12 years Jennifer (Zook) Cohen of Beach, North Dakota; his mother, Joy and his sister, Lorraine (Michael) of London, England. He was preceded in death by his father, Emanuel.

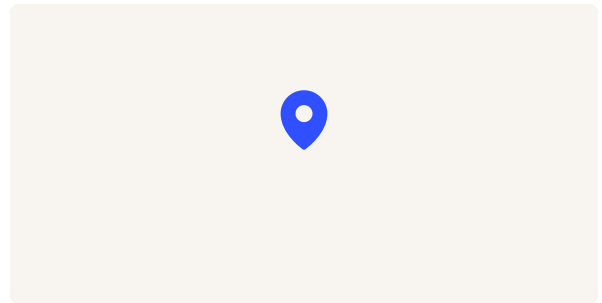

My name is Clive and Stuart was my friend of 35 years. The first time we meet we both came out of rehab. We meet in a meeting and Stuart was looking over at me, it took me a minute to work out who he was but after the meeting we spoke and introduced ourselves. It just happened to be that we had meet around 5 years before. From that time on we were together everyday in our early recovery. We did 90 meetings in 90 days. At that time here in London there was only 5 NA meetings. Stuart started to get really involved in trying to help NA grow. In that time the 5 meetings were all located in the same area of London. Stuart was brought up in East London felt that he needed to start a meeting in East London. From that one meeting that Stuart started there are meetings everyday all over East London. Stuart also had a very big heart and he never forgot where he came from and he was also very proud of his clean time. One memory Stuart in the early days helped many a new comer. On one particular occasion him telling me about a friend that he had known had just come out of prison. He contacted this guy and went to his house to take him to a meeting and today that same guy is 30 years clean and sober. That is only one of many more people that Stuart helped. He carried the message. We've had many experiences in recovery, business. 25 years of being with each other. We've had good days and bad together. In that time I've met many a person but honestly Stuart was a one off. He was very clever, very kind, very loving and very generous. Unfortunately our paths took us on separate ways and things got between us. Unfortunately we never spoke again. I'm very sad that we never spoke again. I've been left with some very fond memories and in the time that I've known Stuart I've always remembered a man that had integrity and if at any time anyone that he knew would have been in any sort of trouble he would have been there for them.
