I threw that right back in his face, since he had the best tan of anyone I know! All that bicycling - he said. I remember during my surgery, (which he did the same day he diagnosed me - he said he knew I wouldn't take him seriously and never come back) he tried to crack jokes, which all fell flat. I told him that it was his German-ness that got in the way of his delivery of the punchline. I made points with the staff, too, that day. His compassion was limitless! Right before surgery he asked if I had insurance and I said no. He said, "Don't worry, we will figure it out." And HE did. I always looked forward to my 6 month and then yearly check up - just to see him and feel his warmth and genuine concern for what was happening in my life. I just read this news, and I am stricken. But if I am late in remembering Dr. Mehrel, that is all right with me, because all that he gave to the world so generously, and naturally, will not be forgotten for many, many years. Maybe never. But I honestly do not think he would care about his being remembered in distant years. What was important to him was his family, we, his patients, and those he worked with...It is no accident I find this today, Sept. 11, 2024. As fate would have it, I had an appointment with him on "the" Sept. 11. He was removing a skin cancer from my face using the Mohs method (removing successive thin layers until the last was cancer free. When I showed up for the appointment, the world was normal. I was given a hospital-gown type thing to wear and laid down on the table. I was completely comfortable with Thomas. He was just so kind. I loved him as I never have another doctor, before or since. I am so grateful that our paths crossed. Anyway, he had just made an incision on my face when one of the staff knocked on the door. I do not think he liked being interrupted during ongoing surgeries. He sighed slightly, and said in his clipped Germanic voice, "Yes, come in." The young lady said "Doctor, New York City has been attacked. A plane..." He dismissed her, and I saw his nostril flare. He was infuriated. I said "Thomas, are you O.K. to do the surgery/" He responded strongly in the affirmative-- "Yes, yes. Yes. I am fine." He scheduled a number of surgeries for the same day, which I learned because there were a few of us, men, women, young, old, and wearing these funky gown things. Thomas was zipping back and forth to his lab. We were generally wandering about, by turns glued to the TV, when I believe we saw the second plane hit. I remember being struck by how beautifully blue the sky was, that day. The experience kind of bound us together. ___It might seem strange, but I felt led today, on the anniversary of that terrible day, because he really, really helped me, more than I immediately realized. I know that you beautiful people (and I say that most sincerely, having read your efforts to speak what cannot be conveyed in words) will understand exactly what I mean, when I say, that just knowing even one person like Thomas, made the world a richer and safer place.
