Well less than three months later just after turning 65 my father died. My dad did not have a good death. I blame Fields. The Oncologist that we took my dad to said Fields should not have operated but rather should have reduced the size of the tumor first. It's a pity that we did not sue this man for malpractice. I just wonder how many other people suffered at the hands of this man.
