She gave us wisdom like only an Auntie could! She was my mother's older cousin but she was more. I remember her telling me about my mom's severe acne as a teen and how mine were bad. As a self conscious teen - she made me feel good!

Although my mom is in the throws of Alzheimer's - I can not bear to tell her one of her favorite cousins has passed ! Another passed a few days before.

Even when Tante Rolla passed - we went to funeral and all she could say was where was Ginette. I still can't tell her.

I am saddened that I only have one pic of her and it was my wedding - sleep in peace - Tante Ginette!
